# MESSAGE FROM CO-FOUNDERS

## Dear Friends, Supporters, and Changemakers,

As we reflect on the past year, we are filled with both a profound sense of gratitude and grief for our community. For seven years, BuildPalestine has stood firm in its commitment to empowering Palestinian changemakers and mobilizing a global community for impact. In 2023, we made strides in service of our mission. At the same time, the ongoing catastrophe in Gaza has challenged us as an organization to adapt in order to meet this critical moment for Palestine.

Our annual BuildPalestine Summit, scheduled for October 7th and 8th, was themed "Reclaiming Funding." In solidarity with our people in Gaza, we canceled the Summit and re-designed it as a webinar series under the theme "Reclaiming Funding in Times of Crisis," which was attended by 732 participants from over 40 countries.

While the Summit did not proceed as planned, its theme is as urgent as ever. With the decimation of essentially every sector in Gaza, rebuilding will require an immense effort. This critical and heart-wrenching juncture offers an opportunity to liberate our funding sources from neo-colonial sources, determine our own development trajectory, and exercise our right as Palestinians to shape the future of Palestine.

At BuildPalestine, our focus revolves around three main pillars: Social Innovation, Social Entrepreneurship, and Community. These pillars will be critical in rebuilding Gaza in a way that ensures sustainability, scalability, dignity, and self-determination. Our community, Palestinians and allies alike, plays a pivotal role in extending solidarity, support, and direct action for changemakers on the ground.

In 2023, we also conducted Social Innovation Bootcamps and our Fellowship Program. Our Social Innovation Bootcamps continued to provide young students and recent graduates with the resources to develop innovative solutions for local challenges. The Fellowship Program nurtured the growth of 8 social enterprises that are making a tangible impact in Palestine.

Looking ahead to 2024, we remain committed to empowering Palestinian changemakers in developing their social enterprises and impacting the lives of people on the ground. The launch of Under the Olive Tree (Ta7t al Zaytouna), a subscription-based virtual platform that convenes a global community of supporters with Palestinian social entrepreneurs, will allow us to accelerate the mobilization of a global community, while generating sustainable revenue for BuildPalestine's work.

We are deeply grateful for each of you who have contributed to our journey. Your support, solidarity, and belief in our mission propel us forward as we continue to build a free Palestine.

# 1. BUILDPALESTINE SUMMIT: RECLAIMING FUNDING

BuildPalestine opens doors for Palestinians and allies from all over the globe to discuss challenges and opportunities under a different theme every year. In 2023, BuildPalestine was planning for the fourth annual summit-themed “Reclaiming Funding” to be a hybrid event, combining engaging virtual discussions with interactive in-person gatherings in Ramallah and Washington D.C.

The 2023 Summit design focused on addressing the challenges and restrictions of funding in Palestine and envisioning alternative financing models that empower grassroots problem-solving and minimize dependency on international aid.

However, our plans and lives as Palestinians, changed dramatically on October 7th. In response to the current situation, we reshaped the structure and customized the topic of the summit that was originally planned for Oct 7&8 into a new webinar series named “Reclaiming Funding in Times of Crisis”.

It was a series of four weekly webinars that created a space for our community to discuss the latest challenges. This includes the vital role of local organizations in responding to humanitarian crises and the importance of social innovation during these critical times. These sessions provided valuable insights, encouraged meaningful discussions, and offered actionable items or activities to facilitate practical steps forward.

## 2. BUILDPALESTINE SOCIAL INNOVATION BOOTCAMP

In our commitment to supporting social innovation, we partnered with university-based incubators to host bootcamps. We see these academic hubs as great places for real and new innovators to grow.

BuildPalestine Social Innovation Bootcamp focuses on enterprises at the early, pre-incubation stage and uses design thinking principles to guide participants through crucial stages like empathy, problem identification, ideation, prototyping, and testing

# #1 Bootcamp: Solving Challenges in the Arts and Fashion Fields



Dar al-Kalima University in collaboration with Zahi Khouri Innovation Hub



12 students and graduates participated (all females)



15-18 March 2023, Bethlehem

Over the course of three vibrant days, participants worked together to explore sustainable practices in the fashion industry, with an emphasis on using local fabrics from Palestine, green fashion and sustainability. The participants actively took part in workshops and idea-generation sessions, leading to creative proposals.





The bootcamp generated a creative atmosphere, encouraging initiatives ranging from upcycling textiles to brainstorming eco-friendly fabrics.

One noteworthy proposal involved the innovative use of natural leaves for fabric dyeing, replacing conventional artificial colors. Another idea focused on the development of a multimedia application designed to safeguard the creative work of young artists, ensuring the protection of copyright for their productions.

Another solution proposed a mobile caravan reaching far and disconnected areas to organize engaging activities for children.

# #2 Bootcamp: Solving Challenges in the Arts and Fashion Fields



Palestine Polytechnic University

This bootcamp adopted a broader perspective, partnering with the Center of Continuous Learning and targeted recent graduates in search of employment. The participants engaged in two projects:

The first involved establishing a recycling business to address the problem of plastic waste pollution in Hebron, collecting and selling plastic to recycling companies; the second project aimed at addressing the issue of unemployment among recent graduates by enhancing their skills and connecting them with job opportunities.







# 3. BUILDPALESTINE FELLOWSHIP

BuildPalestine Fellowship Program is designed for Palestinian social entrepreneurs craving innovative solutions for social and environmental challenges. BuildPalestine provides these entrepreneurs with technical support, and vital connections, and utilizes its network for funding opportunities and tools to emphasize their impact.

In its third year of operation, the Fellowship program offers an intensive 6-month program curriculum tailored to changemakers developing solutions to social or environmental issues. We continue to provide ongoing support to facilitate the sustainable growth of emerging social entrepreneurs.

This year marked significant program enhancements. In addition to bringing in expert mentors to cover specific topics like product development and financial planning, we extended the time allocated for individualized one-on-one coaching sessions which 83.3% of participants found extremely useful. This adjustment aims to create a more personalized and supportive experience. Furthermore, the BuildPalestine team conducted a dedicated field visit with each fellow (note: we were unable to visit our fellow in Gaza due to restrictions in movement), providing us with firsthand insights into their on-the-ground work. Notably, we diligently documented the narrative of each fellow, enriching our understanding of their journeys and contributions.



## NETWORKING:

In the planning of our summit, BuildPalestine incorporated a distinctive and exciting feature called “The Impact Market” to utilize its network in connecting fellows. The Impact Market also aimed to showcase fellows' businesses, connect them with our audience, and open opportunities for investment. We even teamed up with our fellows to make some BuildPalestine merch for the booth. Unfortunately, our plans were disrupted due to the ongoing challenges following the events in Gaza since October 7th



# FUNDRAISING:

BuildPalestine provided support to three enterprises within its fellows program.

We initiated a crowdfunding campaign to raise funds for Hakini, focusing on mental health support for Gazans.

Additionally, Foras and Talleh Cultural Center were granted financial assistance to aid in their business development, particularly during times of crisis. Hakini successfully obtained USD 80,000 through the crowdfunding campaign, while Foras and Talleh Cultural Center each received EUR 15,000 in grants.


## Asmahan Illian - Preserve Palestinian Heritage


## Tasneem Hamad - Mental Math Education

## Abdallah Rayyan - Environmentally Friendly Crops




## Manal Salem - Bedouin Culture Awareness



## Yaqeen Yamani - Enrich Films Culture






## Business Modeling



### Crowdfunding for Hakini's response to the crises in Gaza

#### Hakini - BuildPalestine 2021 Fellow

Hakini, ("tell me", in Arabic), is an online Arabic therapy platform that uses guidance for self-help intervention, teletherapy, and AI to increase accessibility to mental health care in the Arab world.

Since the horrific ongoing aggression began, Hakini rushed to take immediate action to provide mental health support in these traumatizing humanitarian crises Gazans are going through. With the support of BuildPalestine, a crowdfunding campaign was launched to install a toll-free hotline, provide on-ground sessions, and capacity building. The crowdfunding campaign succeeded in raising \$80,000 utilized to achieve Hakini's goals.




# OUR FINANCIALS

In 2023, BuildPalestine raised a total income of USD 289,801, derived primarily from two main sources: grants and individual donations.



In 2023, our organization incurred a total expenditure of USD 220,179, with approximately 68% of this amount allocated to program-related expenses.



# LOOKING AHEAD



Entering 2024, our focus is on the theme of liberation, guiding our efforts in response to the current challenges in Palestine. We're taking proactive steps to address these issues. Our dedication to creating a positive impact stays strong as we navigate these complexities with resilience and purpose.

- 1. Diversifying our Funding:** In our approach, we're dedicated to acknowledging the distinct contributions of individuals and are actively looking for new, authentic supporters. We aim to collaborate with funders who share a strong connection with BuildPalestine's mission and explore creative ways to enhance BuildPalestine's sustainability.

We're also transitioning towards a community-supported model, and we're excited to introduce our digital community, "Under The Olive Tree," with the goal of connecting with **1,000 people by the end of 2024.**

**2. Extending our Commitment to “Reclaiming Funding”:** Recognizing the need for organizations to move away from biased funders, we are committed to assisting other organizations in Palestine. This involves creating and promoting new support models like memberships, volunteerism, and crowdfunding for a more diversified and sustainable funding landscape.

**3. Continuing our Support to Social Enterprises in Palestine:** Whether by supporting our fellows in these challenging times, by extending financial and business development support to help them survive the crises, or by launching our new fellowship cohort prioritizing solutions that can contribute to the rebuilding of Gaza. Moreover, we are continuing our BuildPalestine Fund development process to establish a venture philanthropy fund that invests in early-stage social enterprises.

**4. Guiding Global Supporters for Positive Impact in Palestine:** Despite tough times, we are committed to creating valuable resources that help supporters worldwide contribute to sustainable change in Palestine. This includes information on crowdfunding campaigns, volunteering opportunities, impactful partnerships, advocating for a ceasefire in Gaza, and tips on maximizing the impact of charitable giving.

BuildPalestine upgraded the connection of individuals with on-the-ground organizations in Gaza, bringing people closer to the realities on the field. 
# Outreach & Communication

# UNDER THE OLIVE TREE




As part of the outreach and communication strategy, BuildPalestine launched Under the Olive Tree, a membership community with the primary objective of creating a global community for individuals interested in the social innovation landscape in Palestine.

The community seeks to not only connect Palestinian changemakers, allies, and supporters across the globe but also to generate sustainable funding for its parent organization, BuildPalestine. For a monthly fee of \$12, members can contribute to the vital work of BuildPalestine and also gain exclusive benefits, including insights from individuals directly involved in impacting communities in Palestine, the opportunity to network with passionate individuals worldwide, and access to a comprehensive resource hub to support the growth of their social impact projects.

# OUR PARTNERSHIPS (2023)



**1. Impact Europe :** We have partnered with Impact Europe (previously EVPA) on a regional project called “Impact Together!” which aims to strengthen and promote the social economy as a vector for job creation and expansion of economic opportunities, leading to a more inclusive economy in the Southern Neighbourhood countries. The project’s main objective is to establish venture philanthropy funds to invest in social enterprises across the region.



**2. The Asfari Foundation:** The Asfari Foundation is dedicated to fostering sustainability, resilience, and empowerment within civil society infrastructure, with a particular focus on supporting innovative youth. The foundation envisions a world where individuals have equal opportunities to transform their lives, invest in their communities, and play a pivotal role in shaping the future of their countries. We have received a grant from Asfari which aimed to help us achieve organizational development and support our organizational growth.

## 3. The Mediterranean Universities Union (UNIMED):

EPISODE program with UNIMED aims to empower continuing vocational education and training providers to enhance the resilience, digital readiness, and growth of social entrepreneurship, micro-businesses, MSMEs, and early-stage start-ups in Palestine, with a focus on producing public prosperity. This will be achieved by defining future skills needed for social entrepreneurs in the digital era and aligning such skills to the local unique Palestinian context. The project will upskill teachers/trainers and mentors on innovative tools, online teaching techniques, pedagogies, cutting-edge technologies, and trends in digital social entrepreneurship. It will involve them in co-creating a blended course on Digital Social Entrepreneurship.



4. **KAS** : The Konrad-Adenauer-Stiftung is a political foundation active throughout Germany and abroad. KAS works to promote and preserve free democracy, the social market economy, and the development and consolidation of the value consensus. KAS support was channeled to support our Fellowship Program and Summit.
